Chef Dirk Yeaton is the new executive chef at **Pig and Poet** at the Whitehall Inn in Camden. Yeaton worked with Portland-based catering companies before opening his own restaurant and catering service, Blue House Café, which served the food community for 27 years. Pig and Poet opened last summer under chef Sam Talbot, however he has turned his focus to his Brooklyn-based projects. Yeaton worked with Lark Hotels Group executive chef Justin Perdue to create a new menu for the upcoming season.
